AIDS is not one thing for all people. This installation juxtaposes, emotionally and conceptually, the different meanings and responses people have. Fear as an emotional reflex underlying these meanings and responses is evoked through the use of medical waste and words. A part of the composition is a black framed handwritten personal expressions by those often least heard; persons with AIDS and their care partners.

HARVEY WEISS WAILING WALL March 9 - April 3

This work is an act of retribution, an assault on indifference and denial, a proclamation of loss, for the dead and the living, a wailing wall.
