ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

In 1983 Artists Space initiated a series of special exhibitions with the support of The Mark Rothko Foundation. Through what was then an informal arrangement between the two institutions Artists Space was able to present, on an annual basis, the work of serious artists with considerable experience in their chosen field who had not received the public recognition warranted by their work. In 1988, the Mark Rothko Foundation awarded a grant to Artists Space which will enable us to continue this series annually, through the end of this century.

Painters Tony Bechara, Carmen Herrera and Mac Wells, and performance artist Tom Murrin are each featured with comprehensive presentations of their recent work, as well as in the case of Tom Murrin, a series of public performances. While this exhibition is not thematic, these artists do share an obsession with color, a fascination with abstraction and a directness in their presentation. In addition, each artist has evolved a very specific, uniquely personal formal vocabulary. Herrera's geometric abstractions successfully play off rigidity of form with colorist ebullience; Bechara's obsessively sober black and white grid based paintings softly speak of an understanding of the possibility of riotous color, a tone which is beautifully underscored by the small mosaics in the exhibition; Well's fields of color float gloriously within thinly disguised rigid structures, as if hovering above and within the picture plane; and Murrin's masks, while sharing the painters concern for color and form, create a wonderful counterpoint to the formalism of the other artists, as they admit elements of figuration which suggest representation.


The depth and commitment, as well as the level of artistic achievement of these four artists



BIOGRAPHY


